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Prologue

Abortions have always taken place. For generations, women and people who can become pregnant have shared knowledge of herbs, drugs, strategies, and the names of traditional or biomedical abortionists with each other in order to terminate unwanted pregnancies. In the context of illegality these strategies have come with great costs. As a result of these unsafe abortions, many women have been prosecuted, had their health severely affected, and have even died.

The situation took a turn in 2007, when Mexico City legalized abortion up to the twelfth week of pregnancy. For those in the capital or for those who could easily travel there, this was a huge step forward for dignity and choice.

But the vast majority of Mexicans did not directly benefit from this development and in other parts of the country women and pregnant people have had to continue with unwanted pregnancies or find their own methods of ending the pregnancy. The tireless efforts of activists, including Fondo MARIA, have been crucial in facilitating access to the abortion pills mifepristone and misoprostol or safe surgical abortions, to navigate the complex laws around legal access to abortion, and to support women to travel to Mexico City.

In September 2021 the Supreme Court of Justice of the Nation issued a historic decision that will ensure that women and pregnant people enjoy the constitutional right to freedom and reproductive autonomy, including the right to interrupt

an unwanted pregnancy without facing criminal consequences. Although this

does not mean the immediate elimination of barriers to access safe abortions,

there is no doubt that this landmark ruling will pave the way for the transforma-

tion of the legal landscape of abortion in Mexico.

This graphic novel is a meeting place. The protagonists, Victoria, María and

Gloria, all find themselves in a gynecological clinic and, even while they do not

talk to each other, their stories intertwine. These three stories connect different

trajectories, decisions, and emotional ties, but they are linked because something

in common unites them: experiencing an unwanted pregnancy and deciding to

end it. Through these interwoven individual, but also collective, experiences this

novel asks the reader to consider the complexity of the stories of women who

have abortions, and also the everyday lives in which they travel, make decisions,

and inhabit. In this way it is also a meeting place with ourselves as readers.

Although they are fictionalized stories, each one draws on the experiences of

women and pregnant people with whom Fondo MARIA has worked over the

years. This graphic novel is dedicated to them. And to all those who came before

them. And to those who will go through similar situations - but which we hope

will be radically different now that the laws that criminalize abortion have been


declared unconstitutional.
